After the summer, Eleos likes to fall back into a consistent rhythm with its afterschool program. (See what we did there). Our fall and spring rhythms include weekly basketball, afterschool programming, creative arts, mentoring, field trips, bible study, and our leadership cohort (Lead Project).



October marks the launch of a new cohort of students into our re-entry program. Five students began a journey of coaching, mentoring, goalsetting, and leadership development at Reach.

We recently received word that we will be reentering the Juvenile Detention Center at the beginning of the year. More updates to come!

A Story From Eleos

The ministry of Eleos began a little over 7 years ago as a vehicle for local churches to serve a vulnerable neighborhood in our community. It's tough for churches to do this well. Churches are viewed as threatening or intimidating spaces for many people. We wanted to create a ministry where we could follow the simple but mighty command of Jesus to love our neighbors as we love ourselves. While this is a distinctly Christian mission, we are not a Church. That was intentional. We've never desired to replace the local Church. We want to be a missional vehicle for the wider Church in our city - a space where members of the Church can pursue the work of justice, mercy, and evangelism in the city. The images below represent neighbors who have been loved well, been told (very) good news, and become brothers and sisters in Christ as a result. But these students and staff member were not baptized into the community of eleos...they were baptized into the household of faith through a local church partner (One Community Church). And that's how it should be. These pictures represent answered prayers and ministry partnerships. We thank God for the local Church!

"Jay, Malik, Bibi, Latique, Kamauriyah, Anddy & Seven. All six students and one staff member have such a unique story throughout their time at éleos. God has been at work in each person's lives long before Eleos and will continue to be long after, but what a gift it has been to witness student's hearts being transformed by Jesus right here and now before our eyes. Some students made decisions at Camp Grace in Georgia, some at our girl's and boy's Bible study, some through our lead project group, and some through conversations with mentors over a long period of time. Each faith decision is nothing short of a miracle, and we give the Lord full glory for that! During each conversation, about a faith decision or about baptism, it has been incredible and humbling to see students take ownership over their faith. One student when I asked what made them decide to follow Jesus, they said, "It all just clicked for me. Why would I not follow Him?" Another student just the other day in church was nodding their head in agreement with a sermon alongside her family. Each moment we get to witness these student's seek Jesus is a gift to our ministry. We are eager to see how these students continue to grow in their faith for the many years to come, and we can't wait to dance with them in eternity forever!"

At Eleos, we equip and elevate students to lead in the way of Jesus. There are many ways to define leadership - we define ours based on the life and teachings of Jesus. While we equip students as leaders, we are not in the business of discipleship. We believe that is the work of the local Church. We constantly create space for students to be introduced to Jesus, but for the students who choose to follow him...we connect them to the local Church. We believe the Church is the best space for us to "grow up in the faith." It's also an incredible space to develop cross-class friendships, which many sociologists identify as the most significant factor contributing to economic mobility. When students and churches connect, everyone wins. Churches become more in touch and empathetic... and the lives of our students become deeply enriched. Please join us in praying for more!

The new building is located in Nicholtown with enough space to drastically expand the ministry of Eleos while bringing the rest of our ministries under one roof!

We have secured the capital funds needed for renovations and furnishings, and we hope to finish renovations by late December! However, we are still fundraising for the operational funds needed to expand our ministry under this new roof. 
